#### **TRANSFORMATION**

The HART CULTURE philosophy and 'HC C.I.C Manifesto', 2009 - points to "Transformation of the inside outwards. "your lifes journey has an outer purpose and an inner purpose", E.Tolle outlines.

Murals, help to transform public places into places of staticised thought and reflection on valuable attributes towards the spiritual world.

### **PROCESS**

(1) The concept is discussed in some depth with the 'host'. (2) Key Concepts and drawings are drawn up and presented. (3) Process: Sometimes, it maybe necessary to ask young people, Volunteers; and anybody else that may find value in participating in the 'creative' process' - to assist the lead Artist.

We want our creative Programs at the HC to "Change people's lives" through the capacity to 'Understand" and "Experience". We inject positive flow into their everyday world through these values. The Mural painting gets people 'Into the moment' and thus becomes like a therapy - "everybody should have a crack at painting a themed

The Students learn an important aspect of Teamwork and respect for each other during the creative process. No one emerges a winner of loser, but can define success according to their own needs.
